

Annual IRS 990-N Filing

December 2022

Although not required to pay tax on income, local Leagues with annual gross receipts of \$50,000 or less **are required** to electronically submit Form 990-N, also known as an e-Postcard, to the IRS every year. **There is no paper form**.

Filing is due by the fifteenth day of the fifth month after the close of the local League's fiscal year. This means that for Leagues with a fiscal year July 1-June 30, filing is due November 15. Form 990-N cannot be filed until after the end of the fiscal year.

Organizations that fail to file required Forms 990-N for three consecutive years will automatically lose their tax-exempt status. Revocation of the organization's tax-exempt status occurs on the filing due date of the third consecutively-missed year. Revocation is automatic and cannot be appealed. The League will have to reapply for tax-exempt status to be reinstated. Don't let that happen. Don't be in violation of the law.

In order to file you need the following information:

- 1) EIN Employer Identification Number for your local League.
- 2) Tax year (for a fiscal year ending 6/30/20 you are filing a 2019 990-N)
- 3) Legal name and mailing address of the organization
- 4) Any other names (if any) the organization uses
- 5 Name and address of a principal officer
- 6) Web site address if the organization has one
- 7) Confirmation that annual gross receipts are normally \$50,000 or less

How to File:

Go to www.irs.gov

Hover over File in the bar at the top of the page.

Click on *Charities & Non-Profits* in the drop down menu

In the new screen that opens, scroll down under *Charities and Nonprofits* and click on *Annual Filing and Forms*;

The list will expand; click on Required Filing (form 990 Series)

A list will come up on the right hand side of your screen; click on Form 990-N

A new screen will open: Annual Electronic Filing Requirement for Small Exempt Organizations–Form 990-N(ePostcard)

At the bottom of the page, click the button: Submit Form 990-N (e-Postcard)

A new screen opens: Sign in or Create a New Account

• If you completed the 990-N the previous year, use the same username and password.





• If you have not filed a 990-N before, you will need to create an account.

NOTE: When creating an account, use your personal information. The login ID and password you are creating are for your personal use--to file the organization's Form 990-N. The login ID and password belong to you, not to the organization for which you are filing. With your login ID and

password belong to you, not to the organization for which you are filing. With your login ID and password, you may file a Form 990-N for multiple organizations without the need to register for each organization.

Once you have logged in, you will be prompted to fill in the 7 items listed above.
