# HOW TO GET INVOLVED IN ADVOCACY AND LOBBYING: LWVIL RESOURCES FOR LOCAL LEAGUES

## Advocacy and Lobbying - what's the difference?

Both advocacy and lobbying involve discussing a position with a government official. In very broad terms, advocacy involves a position on an issue; lobbying involves a position on a specific piece of legislation.

# REMEMBER, THE LEAGUE "SPEAKS WITH ONE VOICE."

League members lobby and advocate as individuals. They do not identify themselves as members of the League. Only the President of the League or someone designated by the President is able to speak on behalf of the League. Unless an Action Alert has been issued by LWVIL or LWVUS, local Leagues need to get permission before asking their members to contact state or national officials.
