Redistricting: Illinois Process Lacks Transparency

LWVIL has long held that redistricting should be vested in an independent special commission and should have processes and enforceable standards that promote fair and effective representation at all levels of government with maximum opportunity for public participation. LWVIL is concerned that the current process for drawing state House and Senate district maps, as well as Congressional maps, lacks necessary transparency and leads to partisan gerrymandering.

State Maps: Third Time's a Charm?

The Illinois General Assembly (ILGA) and Governor Pritzker have approved two sets of state redistricting maps, and federal court is now requiring revisions, which means

that in November, Illinois will be on its third, and hopefully final, set of maps.

In June, ILGA approved a set of maps based on estimated Census data, which was necessary in order to meet deadlines set by the state constitution. When accurate Census data, which had been delayed because of Covid restrictions, was released in August, it became obvious that the June maps were inaccurate. New maps were drawn, approved by ILGA, and signed by Governor Pritzker in September.

Both the first and second maps were challenged in court by the Mexican American Legal Defense and Education Fund (MALDEF) and the Republican Party, claiming a violation of the Equal Protection Clause under the Fourteenth Amendment to the US Constitution (One Person, One Vote). The court invalidated the June maps and ruled that because ILGA had not considered input from MALDEF and the Republican Party when drawing the September maps, these organizations may propose revisions. They have until November 8, 2021 to submit revisions, and ILGA will have until November 18, 2021 to respond. The court will review the proposals and approve the final state redistricting maps or make other recommendations.

Congressional Maps

The Senate and House redistricting committees held hearings and are expected to vote on maps before the close of veto session. Currently there are 13 Democrats and 5 Republicans representing Illinois in Congress. With the loss of one Congressional seat the maps as proposed on October 15 could result in an Illinois delegation of 14 Democrats and 3 Republicans.

Coalition Receives United Nations Award

LWVIL is a proud member of the Illinois Clean Jobs Coalition (ICJC), which received the United Nations Global Goals Award this month for its efforts in support of the United Nations Global Goal #7, Affordable and Clean Energy.

The League is one of 200 ICJC member organizations that spent the past three years advocating for the Clean Energy Jobs Act (CEJA) which evolved into the Climate and Equitable Jobs Act and was signed by Governor Pritzker on September 15, 2021. This comprehensive climate and energy bill moves Illinois to the forefront of national environmental justice efforts.

LWVIL environment specialists worked to amplify ICJC advocacy, with witness slips, Time for Action requests, letters to the editor, and written and oral testimony at CEJA's state hearings. League members' response to these requests provided valuable statewide support.

Illinois Voter Guide: Voter Information for All

The <u>Illinois Voter Guide</u> (IVG), which LWVIL first introduced in 2018, has become THE definitive voter guide for every election in the state. IVG is the ultimate one-stop shop for voters statewide.

Inside IVG, voters find everything they need to vote informed: registration information; mail-in ballot applications; dropbox locations; polling place hours and locations; candidate profiles and data; saved ballot choices; an election day help line, and Spanish translations.

Power Across the Entire State

In three election seasons, IVG has covered 14,339 candidates in 6,944 races! LWVIL has uploaded hundreds of local League candidate forum or candidate statement videos, and 24 of our local Leagues submitted candidate questions, contributing to a more robust voter guide! The competitive contract that LWVIL negotiated with our vendor runs through six election seasons from 2020–2023.
